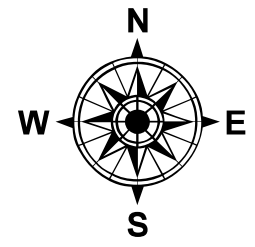




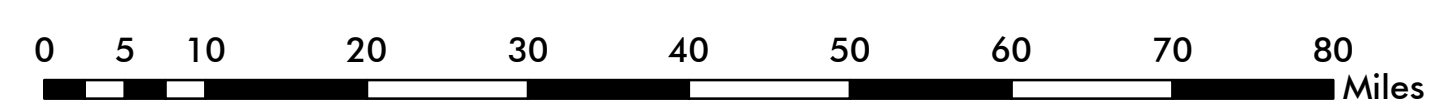
Intercounty Highways: Possible System Additions

This map documents the Intercounty Highway System in Michigan as it exists in 2015. This system is the second statewide, county-based route numbering system used in Michigan. While several of Michigan's 83 counties utilize a locally-determined county road numbering system, the Intercounty Highway program was begun in 1970 in order to provide a consistent, state-wide county numbering system for identifying primary county roads which retained their designations across county lines.
